Who Are the Texans?

Texans Homeschool Baseball is a baseball organization composed primarily of homeschool families geared towards homeschool families. So, the Texans have chosen to prioritize homeschool baseball players.

Our Statement of Faith:

Who can try out for the Texans?

Tryouts for the Texans are for boys who are homeschooled, high school-aged baseball players. Non-homeschooled players who attend tryouts will be considered on a case-by-case basis by our coaches and our Board of Directors.

~If you are a non-homeschooled player and have previously played with the Texans, we will do our best to maintain a spot for you on the Texans! We do want you to know that spots on the team will be filled first by homeschooled players.

Who can play in the Homeschool World Series?

In order to be eligible for the Homeschool World Series Tournament in Florida you must meet these specific requirements:

- The parents shall be involved in their child's education by assuming the role of principal or headmaster, thereby
 - setting the date and requirements for high school graduation
 - selecting and approving course materials and study schedules
 - selecting tutors, correspondence courses, videos, computer courses and similar resources for their child's education.
- It is understood that students may have the opportunity to take dual-credit college courses, particularly in their junior or senior years. This organization encourages such enrollment by homeschool students and the definition above shall not be construed to mean that such students are not homeschooled if they are enrolled in the participating college as a high school student.
- For purposes of eligibility in HWSA activities, those students who attend a cooperative or umbrella school, or a "private" school formed by homeschool parents for legal purposes, shall be considered homeschoolers and shall be eligible; and, furthermore, teams from such schools shall be eligible to participate in HWSA activities and tournaments.

The Texans Homeschool Baseball team has a Code of Conduct that supports our Statement of Faith. All coaches, players, and parents will need to sign the Code of Conduct in order to participate with the Texans.
